WHAT TO DO IF YOU MISS CLASS

If you have missed class (for any reason), these are the steps you should take to figure out what you need to do to get caught up.  - b. Any homework assignments you missed
 - c. Any quiz, test, or other in-class activity you may have missed.

 - a. Handouts can be found in the bins in my classroom.
 - b. Missing tests/quizzes will be in their bin with your name on them.Make a plan with me to make these up!
